Content and objectives

Landscape provides a global and inclusive view to the idea of heritage in two ways. On one hand, it includes both natural and cultural heritage together, in line with the view defended at the European Landscape Convention in the year 2000. Secondly, it also helps us to see some elements of our heritage, listed or otherwise, not as isolated artefacts, but as part of a group, or rather of a setting which makes sense of their existence. At the same time, we are advancing towards more inclusive and plural concepts of landscape and heritage, with shared responsibilities in which society has an increasingly relevant role in assigning heritage status to both natural or cultural elements. The idea of landscape as heritage also offers information for future planning and management, for local economic development, and is also a powerful way of creating public awareness. The workshop will touch on all these issues, which are the core of the Master in Heritage (specialising in Cultural and Natural Heritage) which the UdG will offer from the 2017/2018 academic year.
